Ellesmere College Belize Expedition - July 2019

Dear Explorer,

Ellesmere is offering a once in a lifetime opportunity to visit and work in one of the worlds natural wonders. The Belize barrier reef is the second largest reef system in the world and, with only 10% explored, it is a natural paradise. Working with Blue Ventures, we intend to travel to Belize for a two-week camp. We will help to study the marine life and ecosystems in an attempt to help preserve this reef system and raise awareness of sustainable practice in the community. The trip will provide an unrivalled opportunity to study and learn about this bio diverse area. Blue Ventures is an award-winning marine conservation organisation dedicated to conservation, education and sustainable development in tropical coastal communities.

They have a team of dedicated researchers and volunteers who study all aspects of the marine ecosystem - from fish species and coral all the way through to local fishing techniques and ways of life.

Belize Expedition overview: The focus of the work in Belize is the monitoring of the Bacalar Chico Marine Reserve through surveys carried out by the teams of staff and volunteers. With numerous marine species on the endangered species list found in Bacalar Chico Marine Reserve in northern Belize, including the Goliath and the Nassau Groupers, fish species and abundance surveys are one of the priority monitoring activities presently carried out by Blue Ventures in the region. Research teams are actively involved in collecting baseline data for the area and establishing sites for long term monitoring. This will assess the sustainability of fishing practices and the effectiveness of the existing Marine Protected Areas. Surveys of benthic community composition, coral species diversity, and the size and health of coral colonies are additional priorities of the Blue Ventures team at present, assessing the long term health and resilience of the region's reef ecosystems to future environmental disturbance and climate change.

The huge expanses of mangrove and seagrass ecosystems and the region's extensive seagrass beds are also being monitored by Blue Ventures teams in order to improve the understanding of the status of – and threats to – these vulnerable ecosystems. Northern Belize's mangroves are one of the few remaining strongholds for the West Indian manatee and the American saltwater crocodile, while the region's seagrass beds provide a key food source for both manatees and the 5 species of turtle found in Belize's waters.

The Blue Ventures Expedition in Belize is based at the Dive Camp within the Bacalar Chico Marine Reserve where the expedition team is based. You do not need to have any diving experience to take part in this expedition.

For a 2-week expedition for Ellesmere College, a bespoke training programme and research programme will be developed in collaboration with the teaching staff to meet the objectives for the trip. The science training requirements are dependent on the objectives of the trip, examples of activities that could be undertaken include: snorkel surveys of fish populations in mangroves, bird surveys, manatee surveys, and dolphin surveys. An example itinerary is listed below but as there is a large permanent staff team and two boats there is the flexibility to offer a number of water based activities and surveys.

Expedition fees

For the expedition based at Bacalar Chico Marine Reserve the expedition cost will be £2450. Including flights, meals and transfers outside the UK.

What is and isn't included in the expedition fees:

Included in your expedition cost:

- Expedition accommodation for the duration of the stay in locally constructed cabanas. There is a maximum of 4 people per cabana in bunkbeds. Sheets, pillows and sand-fly nets are provided.
- All group transfers to and from Phillip S.W. Goldson International Airport see itinerary overview for details.
- Three meals per day, including water, tea and coffee during the expedition dates while at BCDC. Meals during transit and off-site are the responsibility of the individual. It may not be possible to cater for all dietary requirements.
- Science Training with the team, including science Survey training
- Comprehensive logistical support and pastoral care from the team of permanent staff the staff team would comprise: an Expedition Manager, two field scientists, two boat captains, a chef and a night-watchman.

- Health and safety provision from the Expedition Manager and field team. Safety protocols and risk assessments are available to view on request. Full Medivac insurance.
- International flights
- Carbon offset donation

Not included in your expedition cost:

- Personal equipment for in-water activities: wetsuit or rash-vest, mask, snorkel, fins Blue
 Ventures can provide detailed lists of requirements
- Personal field equipment: e.g. sleeping bag and torch

- Additional Personal travel insurance, comprehensive policies are recommended The trip will be covered via the comprehensive school trips insurance at no additional cost.
