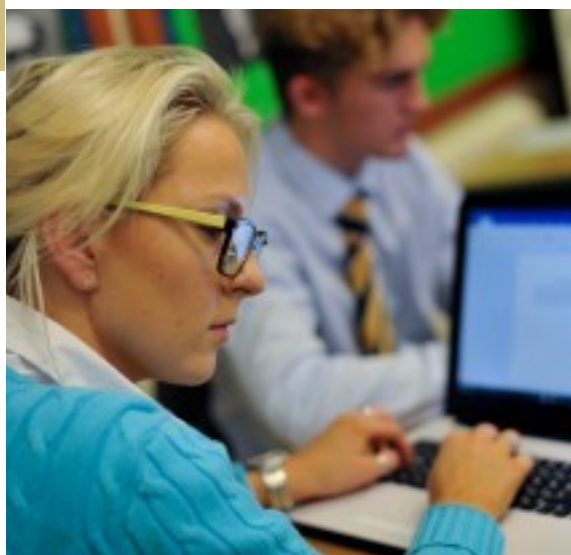
### **College launches Jebb Scholarship to commemorate 100 years**
