MONDULI GREEN - What is it?

Monduli Green is a small charity working in an area in Northern Tanzania near the town of Monduli. We know the local community well and all decisions are made jointly.

It has four main aims:

1. Environmental Improvement

We fund nurseries to grow seedlings which are planted by local village groups or by schools. The land suffers from severe erosion, so the aim is to sustain agricultural use of the land into the future despite climate change.

2. Water

We fund water harvesting systems (mainly guttering and SIM tanks) and also laying water pipes where feasible. We work with villages and schools.

3. Education

- We arrange sponsorships for 12 students to go to secondary school each year (only £125 per year) a total of 36 are being sponsored up to now.
- We fund improvements in educational facilities usually classrooms and toilets.
- A local business helps us provide a breakfast club for a local primary school.
- We plan to improve educational experiences and standards in the schools we work with by supporting extra-curricular activities like sport, art, music and drama.

4. Friendship across cultures

Our students from Ellesmere College and the students of two secondary schools in Monduli live and work together for ten days most summers. In this way many friendships are made.
