# Curriculum Key Stage 2 (Age 7-11)

### **Engage**

The academic curriculum for our pupils reflects the National Curriculum but it is wider in scope. It is aimed at providing a broad education, whilst at the same time preparing pupils ultimately for GCSEs, A-levels and the International Baccalaureate.

We take pride in the achievements of all our pupils and encourage a positive attitude towards work, and reward effort, achievement and behaviour accordingly.

Technology is incorporated into the curriculum, which enables easy access to our online Accelerated Reader Programme that is used with every class to promote higher level reading skills.

Pupils follow a wide and varied curriculum with a strong emphasis on Literacy and Mathematics.


Subjects including French, Music, Art, Design and Technology, which includes ICT and elements of Computer Science, P.E. and Sport are taught by subject specialist teachers.

There are teaching assistants utilised in our youngest classes and this enables group setting, which allows us to more readily meet the needs of the individual learner.

The children are assessed at the beginning of the academic year and targets set. Each pupil is tracked regularly though in-class assessments in English, Mathematics and Science. At the end of Year 6 pupils have a smooth and seamless transition into Year 7.

# Curriculum Key Stage 3 (Age 11-13)

### **Empower**

Teaching is undertaken by subject specialists throughout Years 7 and 8, and the students' form tutor provides their pastoral care and monitors their progress regularly.


The curriculum continues to include English, Maths, Science, History, Geography, RS, Art, Design Technology, Drama, Computer Science, Music, P.E. and Games, and new languages enter the Year 7 and 8 curriculum: Spanish and Latin.

Progress and Effort attainment grades are reported twice a term, known as period grades, which reflect progress in current topics. We report to parents every term, either via a parents' meeting or a written report.

Regular assessment and clear communication of results ensure that progress is closely monitored and appropriate targets set.

Ellesmere College places great focus upon the individual in the educational setting.


We also encourage pupils to develop personal skills, self-reliance and leadership through a wide and varied extracurricular programme.

# Physical Education and Games

#### **Endeavour**

All pupils at Key Stage 2 & 3 will have one double P.E. lesson per week, which is 70 minutes in duration.

The P.E. curriculum ensures that all pupils follow as wide a range of activities as possible.

We believe that young people should be given the knowledge to help them lead a healthy active lifestyle whilst in school and in the future.

During Key Stage 2, pupils will experience the following activities:

As pupils move into Year 7 & 8 they will experience the following activities:
