Ellesmere College House System



There are two systems:

The PASTORAL AND ACADEMIC system based upon the 'Saints' Houses.

The COMPETITIVE system based upon House names from the College's past.

There are three Houses:

Saint Aidan's – for all Middle School Girls.
Saint Cuthbert's – Middle School Boys.
Saint Patrick's – Middle School Boys.

The Boys' Houses take both Boarding and Day pupils.

Boys are allocated by the school to fill the places available and to maintain a balance of boarding and day within the House. There is no parental choice of Saint's House unless there would be a current brother in the House.

Tutors are allocated based upon these Houses.

Meynell Talbot Wakeman-Lambart Woodard.


Pupils remain in their Competitive House for the remainder of their time at Ellesmere.
